



Baldwin Park kicks off Halloween festivities on October 24 with a Race to End Childhood Hunger!

Baldwin Park residents - bring your family and friends to a race before the piles of candy come out! The 6th annual Halloween Hustle 5k race to end childhood hunger is the Junior League of Greater Orlando's premier fundraising event that will take place on **Thursday, October 24, 2013 in Baldwin Park**. This Halloween themed event includes a 5k Run/Walk, Kids' Fun Run and a carnival inspired after party with activities for adults and children. 900 runners participated last year and 1,500 runners are expected at the 2013 event. Halloween costumes are encouraged at the event.

From trick-or-treating for the kids to live entertainment for the adults, it's an event for all ages that lasts from 5 p.m. to 10 p.m. in **Baldwin Park**. Second Harvest Food Bank of Central Florida partners with the JLGO for a canned food drive. The 2012 event raised around 1,640 pounds of food. The 2013 event committee wishes to raise even more food donations with fun incentives like every 10 cans donated gets 1 free drink ticket.

Funds raised support the Junior League of Greater Orlando's core cause of Childhood Health, Hunger and Poverty, benefiting programs in our community that support those causes.
