Our Commitment to the Community In our more than 65-year history of service, the JLGO has contributed more than \$1 million and more than one million hours of service to the Orlando community. Our efforts have helped children, the elderly, and families in the areas of health issues, education, art and cultural endeavors, and the environment.

The JLGO has supported and started programs such as the Crisis Nursery for children with medical and support needs, the Discovery Room at the Orlando Science Center, the Family Support & Visitation Center, the 4C Toy Library, the Orlando Opera Guild, and the ADDitions parent volunteer program in Orange County Public Schools.
